OUR NEW OSTENSORIUM

Our recent Forty Hours Devotion provided a fitting occasion for display of the beautiful and awe-inspiring monstrance acquired through the searchless of Father Gonter. Meticulously ashioned in France, it admirably portrays the artist's theme "To Jesus through Mary."

The base portrays Mary Immaculate standing atop the earth crushing beneath her foot the serpent symbolic of sin while holding aloft in out-stretched arms her Divine Son in the Blessed Sacrament. The four medallions, done in beautiful color, depict scenes from the life of Our Blessed Mother. The twelve gold spheres symbolize the twelve stars in her diadem.

Purchased in New York through donation by an unnamed parishioner, it stands as a monument to the power of intercession invested in Mary, our Mother and to the charity of its donnor who, through inspiration or personal ice was imbued with the sagacity permeating the biblical admonition to wit: "Make for yourselves purses that do not grow old, a treasure unfailing in heaven, where neither thief draws near nor moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be"
