Therefore, those seeking a Letter of Recommendation are expected to attend Mass regularly, live according to Gospel Values, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and be generous in their service of others.

**Parish Registration:** New parishioners are always welcome within the Community of St. Aloysius Gonzaga. Members of the Evangelization Committee meet with new parishioners, sharing with them information on our parish and inviting the new parishioners to become actively involved in the faith life and ministerial opportunities of our parish.

**REFLECTING ON THE WORD OF GOD:** This week and next, our Gospel readings invite us to consider John the Baptist and his relationship to Jesus. John the Baptist appears in the tradition of the great prophets, preaching repentance and reform to the people of Israel. To affirm this, Luke quotes at length from the prophet Isaiah. John proclaims that we must "prepare the way of the Lord" by repenting. Isaiah and John both describe repentance as a leveling and a straightening out of the uneven and crooked shape of our lives. They call us to ask whether our path is taking us closer to God as well as opening up for others the way to God. John baptizes for repentance and for forgiveness of sins, preparing the way for God's salvation. John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus, we too are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming. We respond to John's message by repentance and reform of our lives. We are also called to be prophets of Christ, who announce by our lives the coming of the Lord, as John did.

**IN THE WORDS OF POPE FRANCIS:** On this second Sunday of Advent, the Liturgy places us in the school of John the Baptist, who preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Perhaps we ask ourselves, "Why do we have to convert? Conversion is about an atheist who becomes a believer or a sinner who becomes just. But we don't need it. We are already Christians. So we are okay". But this isn't true. In thinking like this, we don't realize that it is precisely because of this presumption — that we are Christians, that everyone is good, that we're okay - that we must convert: from the supposition that, all things considered, things are fine as they are and we don't need any kind of conversion. But let us ask ourselves: is it true that in the various situations and circumstances of life, we have within us the same feelings that Jesus has? Is it true that we feel as Christ feels? For example, when we suffer some wrongdoing or some insult, do we manage to react without animosity and to forgive from the heart those who apologize to us? How difficult it is to forgive! "You're going to pay for this" - that phrase comes from inside! When we are called to share joys or sorrows, do we know how to sincerely weep with those who weep and rejoice with those who rejoice? When we should express our faith, do we know how to do it with courage and simplicity, without being ashamed of the Gospel? Thus we can ask ourselves so many questions. We're not all right. We must always convert and have the sentiments that Jesus had. \

**ADDITIONAL ADVENT MATERIALS:** There are a variety of Advent materials available free-of-charge in the Trautenberg Library. Materials are for children as well as for adults. Take as many as you need and share them with others. This is another wonderful way to help others prepare for the Coming of the Lord.

**NITE AT THE MOVIES:** Advent Family Sunday Nite at the Movies is this Sunday – December 9<sup>th</sup> – at 6:15PM in our school cafeteria.
