Letters of Recommendation: Those chosen to be Godparents at Baptism or Sponsors at Confirmation are to be role models in the practice of the Catholic Faith. Therefore, those seeking a Letter of Recommendation are expected to attend Mass regularly, live according to Gospel Values, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and be generous in their service of others.

Parish Registration: New parishioners are always welcome within the Community of St. Aloysius Gonzaga. Members of the Evangelization Committee meet with new parishioners, sharing with them information on our parish and inviting the new parishioners to become actively involved in the faith life and ministerial opportunities of our parish.

REFLECTING ON THE WORD OF GOD: In these days after our Easter Celebration, the Word of God proclaimed at Mass is meant to deepen our Faith in the Resurrection of Jesus. As we see the Risen Christ alive in Peter, John and the other Apostles, we are called to reflect how the Risen Lord is alive in our minds and hearts, experienced through our words and actions.

Jesus enters a room where the disciples are gathered in fear and says "Peace". He touches them. He reminds them they are not alone – He is with them. He gives them the Spirit that leads to the forgiveness of sins – the celebration of God's Divine Mercy. The touch of Peter's shadow brings healing to the sick. Jesus is alive in Peter and the other disciples. John tells the early Christian communities to not be afraid because the Risen Christ is with them.

The Risen Christ is alive in us. Through our words and actions, we are to bring His Presence to all we meet, to wherever our journeys take us. By our faith and love, we are to be signs of the Presence of Christ in our homes and places of work, our schools and our neighborhoods. Our lives are to announce the tomb is empty, Jesus lives in our midst!

We bring the Word of God to prayer: "My Lord and God, you are the One who brings calm when I am afraid, healing when I am diseased, and freedom when sin holds me bound. Touch my wounds and free me to bring your mercy and peace to our hurting and divided world. Amen!"

IN THE WORDS OF POPE FRANCIS: "Easter, brothers and sisters, is the feast of tombstones taken away, rocks rolled aside. God takes away even the hardest stones against which our hopes and expectations crash: death, sin, fear, worldliness. Human history does not end before a tombstone, because today it encounters the 'living stone', the risen Jesus. We, as Church, are built on him, and, even when we grow disheartened and tempted to judge everything in the light of our failures, he comes to make things new, to overturn our every disappointment...Each of us is called tonight to rediscover in the Risen Christ the one who rolls back from our heart the heaviest of stones. So let us first ask: *What is the stone I need to remove, what is the name of this stone?*...Let us put the Living One at the center of our lives. Let us ask for the grace not to be carried by the current, the sea of our problems...Let us seek him, let us allow ourselves to be sought out by him, let us seek him in all things and above all things, And with him, we will rise again."

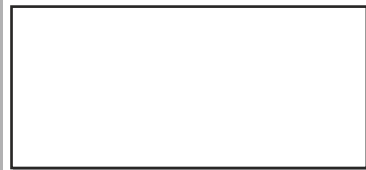
