Therefore, those seeking a Letter of Recommendation are expected to attend Mass regularly, live according to Gospel Values, be at least 16 years of age, have received the Sacrament of Confirmation, and be generous in their service of others.

**Parish Registration:** New parishioners are always welcome within the Community of St. Aloysius Gonzaga. Members of the Evangelization Committee meet with new parishioners, sharing with them information on our parish and inviting the new parishioners to become actively involved in the faith life and ministerial opportunities of our parish.

**REFLECTING ON THE WORD OF GOD:** This portion of John's Gospel comes near the end of the first of four chapters that make up Jesus' long farewell discourse at the Last Supper. This section of chapter 14 actually sums up the themes of the opening of the discourse: the Christian's life is not shaped by Jesus' absence but by God's abiding presence; God's presence overcomes anxiety about God's absence; and the present holds in it the seeds of a fresh future shaped by love, not fear. These verses also contain a glimpse of some of the other themes of the farewell discourse: Jesus' relationship with the Father and the disciples' relationship to Jesus connect the disciples to the Father as well. Jesus promises to send an Advocate or intercessor that will remind the disciples of everything that Jesus taught them and bring them peace. Jesus is preparing his disciples in advance for his absence so that they will continue to believe in him and not feel all alone after his return to the Father. After the initial excitement of his Easter appearances, Jesus will remain with his followers in a very different way throughout the centuries. As our celebration of the Easter season is coming to an end, the liturgy reminds us that Jesus remains with us through the Holy Spirit, who teaches us everything we need to know, reminds us of all that Jesus taught, and brings us peace.

**IN THE WORDS OF POPE FRANCIS:** Today's Gospel takes us back to the Upper Room. During the Last Supper, before confronting his passion and death on the cross, Jesus promises the Apostles the gift of the Holy Spirit, who will have the task of teaching and recalling [Jesus'] words to the community of disciples. Jesus says: "the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you". Teach and recall. This is what the Holy Spirit does in our hearts. At the moment in which he is about to return to the Father, Jesus foretells of the coming of the Spirit who will first teach the disciples to understand the Gospel ever more fully, in order to welcome it in their existence and to render it living and operative by their witness. While he is about to entrust to the Apostles the mission of taking the Gospel to all the world, Jesus promises that they will not be alone. The Holy Spirit, the Counselor, will be with them, and will be beside them, moreover, will be within them, to protect and support them. Jesus returns to the Father but continues to accompany and teach his disciples through the gift of the Holy Spirit. The second aspect of the Holy Spirit's mission consists in helping the Apostles to remember Jesus' words. The Spirit has the task of reawakening the memory, recalling Jesus' words. The divine Teacher has already communicated all that he intended to entrust to the Apostles: with Him, the Word made flesh, the revelation is complete. The Spirit will recall Jesus' teachings in the various concrete circumstances of life, so that they may be put into practice. That is precisely what still happens today in the Church, guided by the light and the power of the Holy Spirit, so that he may bring to everyone the gift of salvation, which is the love and mercy of God.

SAINT PETER'S SQUARE, SUNDAY, 1ST MAY 2016

**FEAST OF THE ASCENSION:** This Thursday – May 30<sup>th</sup> – is the Feast of the Ascension of Christ into heaven. It is a Holy Day of Obligation for all Catholics.

The Feast of the Ascension is celebrated 40 days after Easter. For forty days, Christ appeared to His disciples to strengthen them in their Faith that He was alive – that the tomb is empty! Now Christ returns to His Father after commanding His disciples to bring the Gospel to the ends of the earth.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* put it this way: "Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father's glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his body, may live in the hope of one day being with him forever." (#666)

Please note carefully the times of Masses for the Feast of the Ascension. And, of course, if it is more convenient to participate at Mass in a church closer to your place of work – or if another parish's Mass schedule is more convenient – than please worship there. The important thing is that you join other members of the Church in celebrating the Feast of the Ascension.

**SUMMERFEST:** Now is the time to get serious in planning for our 2019 Summerfest – Sunday, June 30<sup>th</sup> – Noon to 6PM - indoors and outdoors on our parish grounds. Here are some things all of us can do to make the event successful – socially and financially.

**CATHOLIC BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP:** Our meeting of the Catholic Book Discussion Group was moved to this **WEDNESDAY, MAY 29<sup>TH</sup>** at 7PM in the rectory. We will continue to reflection upon Chapter 4 (“Signs of Holiness in Today’s World”) of Pope Francis’ Apostolic Exhortation, *Rejoice and Be Glad*. If you have misplaced your Discussion Outline or need a copy, the Outline can be found in the Trautenberg Library on the rectory. In this chapter, our Holy Father really opens our eyes to make us even more aware of the many ways God is present in our world and the many ways God is calling each of us to holiness of life – to become saints. All are invited – even if you have never attended before or had a chance to read the writings of Pope Francis.

**CATHOLIC CHARITIES:** Our diocesan effort to bring Hope to our neighbors in need – through the Catholic Charities Appeal and through the Bishop’s Fund for the Faith – continues until June 30<sup>th</sup>. As of May 22<sup>nd</sup>, \$43,899.00 has been contributed from 201 donors from St. Al’s. **NEED FOR USHERS AND COLLECTION COUNTERS:** Because of age and illness, several of our ushers and collection counters have had to step aside after serving our parish in both of these responsibilities for many, many years. This, of course, creates vacancies that must be filled.

Our ushers do much more than simply take up the collection. They really are the first to greet our parishioners and visitors when they enter church. They provide guidance and directions for guests. They ask those gathered in prayer to bring up the gifts. They help to create an atmosphere of prayer and reverence by the way they participate in the Mass.

Our collection counters have the very serious responsibility of accurately counting the weekly collection – usually once a month, from after the 9AM Mass until about Noon. The collection is counted; then two counters take the collection directly to the bank. One of the Counting Teams is made up of women from the parish.

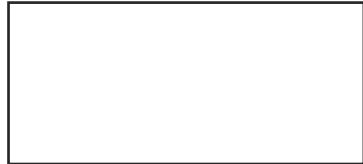
